

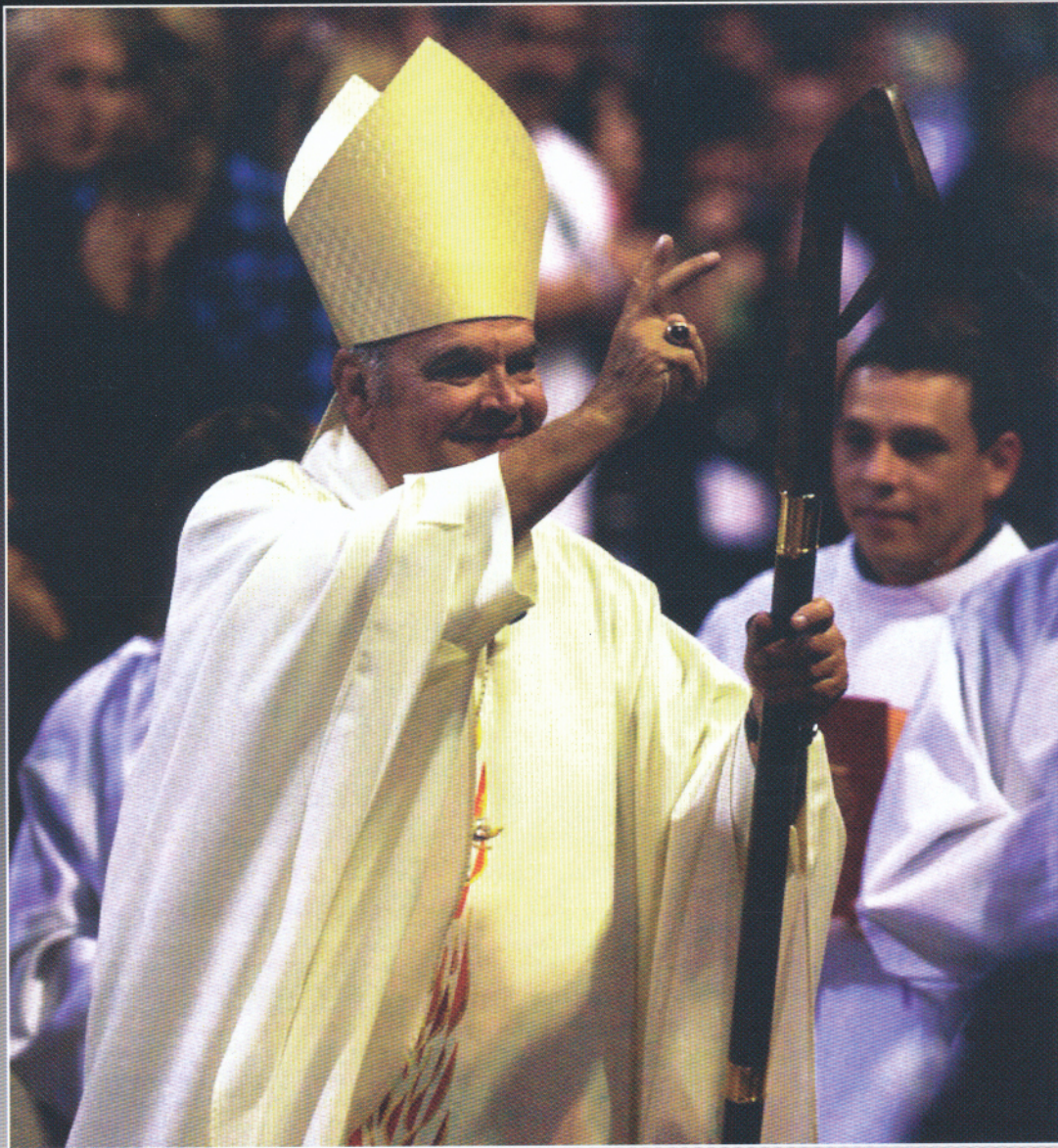

Born in Los Angeles, California, July 16, 1937.

Attended the Archdiocesan Junior Seminaries for his high school and his first two years of college.

Attended St. John's Major Seminary in Camarillo, California, for his studies in philosophy and theology.

May 1, 1963, ordained to Priesthood at St. Vibiana's Cathedral in Los Angeles, by James Francis Cardinal McIntyre.

Served as Associate Pastor in two parishes (predominately Spanish-speaking) in East Los Angeles:

Resurrection Parish, May 1, 1963

Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, February 23, 1971.

December 11, 1972, assigned as Administrator Pro Tem in the predominately Spanish-speaking parish of Santa Isabela in East Los Angeles.

April 24, 1973, assigned as Associate Pastor at St. Vibiana's Cathedral, downtown Los Angeles.

April 25, 1978, named a Chaplain of His Holiness by Pope Paul VI.

1979-1980, served as President of the Los Angeles Priests' Council.

1979-1982, served on the Board of Consultors of the Los Angeles Archdiocese.

February 1, 1981, assigned as Parochial Vicar of St. Vibiana's Cathedral, Los Angeles.

May 29, 1984, appointed Titular Bishop of Midila and Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Orange, California, by Pope John Paul II.

July 14, 1984, Consecrated as Bishop by Timothy Cardinal Manning, in the Diocese of Orange.

July 18, 1984, appointed Vicar General of the Diocese of Orange.

July 29, 1986, elected Diocesan Administrator by the Board of Consultors of the Diocese of Orange on the death of Bishop William Johnson.

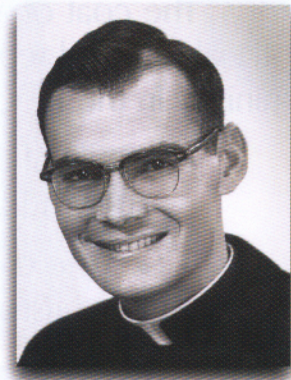
January 27, 1987, appointed as the Third Diocesan Bishop of the Diocese of Santa Rosa, California, by Pope John Paul II.

October 15, 1991, appointed as the Fourth Diocesan Bishop of the Diocese of Fresno, California, by Pope John Paul II.

March, 25, 1997, The Miracle at the San Joaquin Country Club. Bishop Steinbock had a hole in one on the 11th hole (Par 3) at San Joaquin Country Club.

2003, "Ministry of Presence: Vignettes of Skid Row and East Los Angeles" was published.

Coat of Arms of the Most Revered John T. Steinbock, Fourth Bishop of Fresno

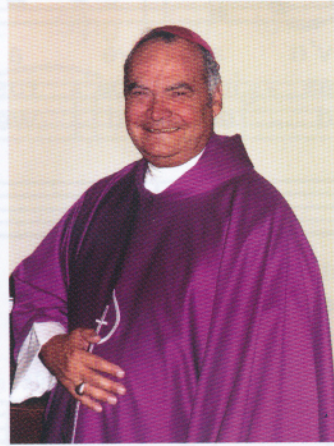
The coat of arms for Bishop Steinbock is his official seal and represents his Christian faith and his ministry in the Diocese of Fresno.

- Personal Blazon (right side) – A cross, the sun, and a star
- The Cross – is at the center of the Christian life, signifying God's great love for us, His call to offer ourselves in love and sacrifice for others, and His strength to be faithful to that call.
- The Sun – rendered in gold against a red-orange background, signifies the glory of God and the universality of His love.
- The Star – a symbol from the Steinbock family coat of arms, is the star which guides us on the pilgrimage through this world. It also calls to mind our Blessed Mother, under the title, "Morning Star".
- Diocesan Blazon (left side) – A continuous chain made up of eight distinct links. A bold cross.
- The Chain Links represents the eight counties that make up the Diocese of Fresno, namely the counties of Fresno, Kings, Inyo, Kern, Madera, Mariposa, Merced and Tulare.
- The Cross reminds us of the central mysteries of our faith and the foundation of ours and every local church.



The external ornaments are composed of the pontifical hat with its six tassels on each side, disposed in three rows, all in green, and the Episcopal cross tinctured in gold. These are the heraldic insignia of a prelate of the rank of Bishop by the instruction of the Holy See of April 17, 1969. Before 1870, the pontifical hat was worn at solemn cavalcades held in conjunction with papal functions. The color of the pontifical hat and the number of tassels were signs of the rank of a prelate, a custom which is still preserved in ecclesiastical heraldry.

The motto, "All for the Love of God," was taken by the bishop during a retreat when he first entered the major seminary in 1957. It epitomizes the motive of everything in living the Christian life: prayer, daily responsibilities, the everyday ordinariness of our lives, our struggles to follow the Lord Jesus. It symbolizes the offering of our lives to God, in the spirit of love and thanksgiving to Him who has first loved us.
