We compiled our data on the cost of child care using a variety of sources.

The Children's Council of San Francisco (childrenscouncil.org) provided us with a county by county breakdown of the cost of child care centers and Licensed in-home child care. The information is from the California Child Care Resource and Referral Network as of 2007. (rrnetwork.org)

No such information is available on the average cost of hiring an au pair or nanny. For that, we called three reputable au pair agencies and 3 reputable nanny agencies. The au pair agencies chosen were recommended by the Children's Council of San Francisco.

In home child care providers and child care centers are licensed by California Community Care Licensing in the Department of Social Services. (ccld.ca.gov/PG411.htm).

Au Pairs are <u>regulated by the State Department</u>. Au Pairs must work a minimum of 1 year and can be extended to a second year. After that, they are required to return to their home country. It is primarily a <u>culture exchange program</u>.

Nannies do not fall under the jurisdiction of any government regulators. However, if you go through a nanny agency, you should ask how they screen their nannies and if their nannies go through a criminal background check. You can hire a nanny from Craigs List much cheaper, but if you do, make sure you check references and do a background check. Most nanny agencies will do that for you.

As we mentioned, choice shouldn't be the only factor when choosing child care. For additional help, you can refer to information from the <u>Children's Council of San Francisco</u> and the <u>California Child Care Resource and Referral Network</u>.
