Dear Commander Magee:

Thank you for your recent letter and the additional information provided on the housing structures and the Administration Building at the Galveston, Texas USCG Base. It appears in the photographs that some modern alterations have been made to these buildings which would disqualify them for individual listing in the National Register of Historic Places on the basis of their architecture. However, as a group the buildings maintain sufficient integrity to form an historic district. Based on the historical significance of Fort Crockett and the large concentration of pre-World War II structures it contains, the installation is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places as a district under Criterion A.
