Election officials launch Early Voting for 2008 Primary

Election officials joined advocates for voters with disabilities Monday to launch the 18-day Early Voting program – and to urge voters to use Early Voting by January 31. Officials noted how all Early Voting sites are fully accessible and that Early Voting will help voters avoid possible lines at the “Super Duper Tuesday” primary election on Feb. 5.

During Early Voting, voters don't need a reason or excuse – just a government-issued photo ID. During Early Voting, Chicagoans may vote at any of the 51 Chicago Early Voting sites. Voters from the suburbs of Cook County may use any of the 44 suburban Cook County Early Voting sites, plus the County Clerk's Office at 69 W. Washington in Chicago.

On the General Primary Election Day (February 5), voters may cast ballots only at the polling place assigned to their precincts.

“This is the first time Early Voting will be offered in Illinois during a presidential election cycle,” said Cook County Clerk David Orr. “You don't need a reason or excuse to use Early Voting. But this year, there's a great reason: Early Voting might save you time if there's heavy turnout Feb. 5.”

Chicago Election Board Chairman Langdon D. Neal said there have been many signs that suggest turnouts will be higher than the 2004 primary. “The Iowa caucuses and New Hampshire primary shattered the old records for turnout. Also, this is the first time Illinois will have an earlier primary date – before the presidential nominations are known. Lastly, we recently saw a last-minute rush of 30,000 new registrations in six days. That's never happened in Chicago before any presidential primary.”

Chicago Election Board Commissioner Marisel A. Hernandez added, “Early Voting will be the key to a smooth primary – whether we have record turnouts, bad weather, or both come Feb. 5.”

In Chicago, all 51 Early Voting sites in the city will be open Monday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., including Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day. On Sundays, Early Voting for Chicagoans will be offered only on the Sixth Floor, 69 W. Washington St., Chicago, from 9 a.m. to noon.

Election Officials Launch Early Voting / Add One
January 14, 2008

Voters registered in the suburbs of Cook County may use any of 44 Early Voting sites in suburban Cook County. All suburban Cook County sites will be open Monday through Friday, 8:30 to 5 p.m. and on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to noon. The Cook County Clerk's Office and its satellites in the suburban courthouses will be open Sundays from 9 a.m. to noon. Of the 44 suburban Cook County sites, 37 will be open on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

Karen Tamley, Commissioner for the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities, said launching Early Voting at the offices of Access Living, 115 W. Chicago Ave., was symbolic. Access Living, which provides services to people with disabilities, is the first private facility to host Early Voting in Chicago.

"The reason we're here at Access Living is to point out one more advantage to Early Voting: All of the sites used in Early Voting in Chicago and suburban Cook County are fully accessible," Tamley said. "Election officials try to find fully accessible polling places in every precinct on Election Day, but some neighborhoods do not have such sites available. In Early Voting, that's not an issue."

Access Living President and CEO Marca Bristo said her organization was proud to serve as the first private facility to host Early Voting in the city. "The Access Living offices also will host polling places for several surrounding precincts in the Near North 42nd Ward on February 5," Bristo said. "We are excited about serving our neighbors and working with many groups who are advocates for accessibility to tell of the advantages of Early Voting."

The Chicago Election Board and the County Clerk's Office have expanded campaigns to promote Early Voting ahead of the Feb. 5 primary. The efforts included mass mailings, television and radio public service announcements, outreach to elected officials, and bulletins to community groups, political campaigns and news organizations.

Early Voting was introduced in Illinois in 2006. Since then, the percentage of ballots cast in Early Voting has grown steadily in Chicago:

- 2006 Primary: 14,437 of 416,303 ballots (3.47% of total turnout)
- 2006 General Election: 24,858 of 670,222 (3.71% of total turnout)
- 2007 Municipal Election: 23,759 of 465,706 (5.10% of total turnout)
- 2007 Aldermanic Run-Offs: 8,061 of 96,052 (8.39% of total turnout)
