## Mayor Tony Chavonne Announces Decision Not to Seek Re-election

**Fayetteville, NC**. Eight years ago on a blistery winter day Joanne and I stood in front of Massey Hill High School to begin to talk about an exciting journey for this city.

It has been an exciting journey for both of us as well. The historic image and economic transformation we have helped lead for this city have been one of the greatest blessings of our lives. And while we can see the tangible results of our efforts in the higher quality of life our residents enjoy, in neighborhood sidewalks, in new buildings and roads, and in the faces of our youth who are electing to stay here - it will always be the people that touched our lives along the way that we will remember most.
