And this year, at a time when legislators were looking high and low for places to cut programs to balance the state budget, he fought to secure an additional \$14.1 million in funding to provide low-income people living with HIV with life-saving medications--more than doubling the state contribution to this critical program to ensure that those most in need were served.

Over the last three years, the Speaker worked closely with Equality NC and our coalition partners to finally do something to make our schools safer for all students. When it came time to vote on the School Violence Prevention Act last year, Joe Hackney personally secured the last few votes we needed for passage, and then cast the tie-breaking vote that secured this historic victory.
