

#### HURRICANE CHECKLIST

#### **BEFORE THE STORM**

 Find out if you live in an evacuation zone on page 4

Fill up car with gas

 Gather first aid supplies & prescription medications

Fill your freezer with containers or bags of water, which will help if the power goes out

Clear clogged gutters & drains

Store valuables & papers in waterproof containers on the highest level of your home

 Take video or photos for a home inventory

Check your insurance policies. Collect documents and recent pictures of children/elders in case they go missing

Microchip pets

Fill containers you already have with water

#### **DURING THE STORM**

-Stay inside away from windows, skylights, & glass

 Keep supply of flashlights & extra batteries handy

Avoid open flames as a source of light

If power is lost, turn off major appliances to reduce power "surge" when electricity is restored

-Listen to a battery-operated radio or TV for updates if your cellphone loses service

Go to the highest level of the building if you are trapped by flooding. Do not climb into a closed attic because you may become trapped by rising flood waters

Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters. Turn around. Don't drown!

#### AFTER THE STORM

If you have evacuated, do not return home until officials announce your area is ready

Know and follow all safety guidelines for generators

Beware of outdoor hazards such as downed power lines, poisonous snakes, weakened bridges, washed out roads, weakened limbs on trees, and/or damaged overhanging structures

Do not use the telephone unless absolutely necessary

 Do not drink or prepare food with tap water until you are certain it is not contaminated

Take video or still pictures of damaged property and notify insurance

Keep records of your clean up costs

#### PORTABLE VS STANDBY GENERATORS

#### STANDBY GENERATORS

- Permanently installed outside the home
- Runs on natural gas or propane
- \*Turns on automatically when the power shuts off, even if you're away from home



Standby generators can power everything in your home, including lights, heating/cooling systems, appliances, sump pumps, security systems and more

#### **PORTABLE GENERATORS**

- \*Use properly rated extension cords (electrical load and length)
- Make sure the generator is properly vented to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning
- Don't place it in your home or an enclosed space like a garage
- Don't connect it directly to your home's electrical system.
  Electricity could flow backward into the power lines and endanger lives
- Plug appliances directly into the portable generator

## **HURRICANE PREP CHECKLIST**

Water - 2 quarts to 1 gallon per day per person	Toilet paper
Canned foods: soup, tuna,	Diapers
etc.	lce chests
Powdered milk	Batteries
Canned vegetables and fruits	Paper plates
Snacks (cookies, crackers, granola bars, etc.)	Plastic cups, forks, knives, and spoons
Snack spreads (peanut butter, jelly, cheese spread, etc.)	Insect repellent & candles
Cereal	Charcoal
Bread	Charcoal lighter fluid
Duct tape	Sterno canned heat
