9	offender who was laying in the front yard of 6610
10	Sangamon. There was also a third officer who was
11	standing over the offender, uh, a pistol, which was
12	laying in the middle of the street, as I had
13	previously stated.
14	Q Okay.
15	A That was basically it. I saw him running,
16	saw the offender laying in the in the grass, and
17	helped secure, and helped to place the offender in
18	custody.

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

The R/I observed two video cameras: one located on the exterior of the building facing 66th St. (West) and the other located on the exterior of the building facing Sangamon (East). The R/I spoke with owner/manager, Mahmoud Othman, who related that the store closed early (1500 hours) on 16 June 2013 in observance of Father's Day. Mr. Othman further related that the video in his store does not record and there is no footage recorded or saved that captured the incident.

The R/I, along with Investigator Campbell and Intern Alexsandra Bielawiec, then went to Morgan Mini Mart, located on the Southwest corner of 66th St. and Morgan. The R/I spoke with manager, Mussa Deffala, who related that the store has a surveillance camera located on the sidewalk along 66th St. The camera records footage, but Mr. Deffala did not know how to view and/or copy the recording. Mr. Deffala can be reached at (773) 651-3213 to arrange a time with IT personnel to view and copy the footage. Morgan Mini Mart is open daily from 0800 to 2000 hours.







Duty to Avoid Unnecessary Costs of Service of Summons

Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure requires certain parties to cooperate in saving unnecessary costs of service of the summons and complaint. A defendant located in the United States who, after being notified of an action and asked by a plaintiff located in the United States to waive service of summons, fails to do so will be required to bear the cost of such service unless good cause be shown for its failure to sign and return the waiver.

It is not good cause for a failure to waive service that a party believes that the complaint is unfounded, or that the action has been brought in an improper place or in a court that lacks jurisdiction over the subject matter of the action or over its person or property. A party who waives service of the summons retains all defenses and objections (except any relating to the summons or to the service of the summons), and may later object to the jurisdiction of the court or to the place where the action has been brought.

A defendant who waives service must within the time specified on the waiver form serve on the plaintiff's attorney (or unrepresented plaintiff) a response to the complaint and must also file a signed copy of the response with the court. If the answer or motion is not served within this time, a default judgment may be taken against that defendant. By waiving service, a defendant is allowed more time to answer than if the summons had been actually served when the request for waiver of service was received.

FIRST AMENDED COMPLAINT AT LAW

NOW COMES the Plaintiff, Chantell Brooks, as Special Administrator of the Estate of Michael Westley, deceased, by and through her attorney, David S. Lipschultz, and complaining of the Defendants, Chicago Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz and the City of Chicago, states as follows:

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 1. This action is brought pursuant to the United States Constitution; 42 U.S.C. §1983 and §1988 (the Civil Rights Act of 1871); and the laws of the State of Illinois, to redress deprivations of the civil rights of the Plaintiff's Decedent, accomplished by acts and/or omissions of the Defendants and committed under color of law.
 - 2. This Court has jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1343, §1331 and §1367.
- 3. Venue is proper in this judicial district pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1391, as the acts complained of took place in this district.

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PARTIES

- 4. The Plaintiff, Chantell Brooks, is a United States citizen and a resident of the State of Illinois, County of Cook. Ms. Brooks was the mother of Michael Westley, deceased. Chantell Brooks has been appointed as Special Administrator of the Estate of Michael Westley, deceased, in the Circuit Court of Cook County.
- 5. Defendant Chicago Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz (hereinaster "Officer Paruszkiewicz") is an employee of the Desendant City of Chicago, serving as a police officer. At all times relevant to this Complaint at Law Officer Paruszkiewicz was acting within the scope of employment of the City of Chicago and was acting under color of law.
 - 6. Defendant City of Chicago is a municipal corporation in Cook County, Illinois.
- 7. On June 16, 2013, at approximately 10:00 p.m., the Plaintiff's decedent, Michael Westley (hereinafter "Michael"), 15 years old, was a pedestrian located on the 6600 block of South Sangamon Avenue, in the City of Chicago, County of Cook, State of Illinois.
- 8. At that time and place, Officer Paruszkiewicz used inappropriate, unwarranted, and unjustifiable force against Michael, shooting him with a firearm without lawful cause or justification.
- Michael died as a result of the gunshot wounds inflicted upon him by Officer
 Paruszkiewicz.
- 10. Michael endured pain and suffering in his dying moments as a result of the injuries caused by the shooting.

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COUNT I 42 U.S.C. § 1983 EXCESSIVE FORCE AGAINST POLICE OFFICER KEVIN PARUSZKIEWICZ

- 11. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 10 by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 12. The force used by Officer Paruszkiewicz against Michael was objectively unreasonable and excessive, and was undertaken intentionally, with reckless indifference to Michael's constitutional rights.
- 13. The conduct of Officer Paruszkiewicz constituted excessive force in violation of the Fourth and Fourteenth Amendments to the U.S. Constitution, and the Civil Rights Act (42 U.S.C. §§1983, 1988).

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff, Chantell Brooks, as Special Administrator of the Estate of Michael Westley, deceased, prays that judgment be entered against Defendant Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz awarding damages for loss of life, conscious pain and suffering, additional compensatory damages, punitive damages, reasonable attorney fees and costs, and such further relief as this Court deems just.

ILLINOIS WRONGFUL DEATH ACT AGAINST POLICE OFFICER KEVIN PARUSZKIEWICZ AND CITY OF CHICAGO

- 14. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 10 by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 15. Pursuant to the Illinois Wrongful Death Act, 740 ILCS 180/1, et seq., Plaintiff brings this action for the next of kin of Michael Westley to recover for the losses suffered as a result of the death of Michael Westley.

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16. The actions of Officer Paruszkiewicz, acting within the scope of employment for the City of Chicago, were the direct and proximate cause of the death of Michael Westley.

17. As a direct and proximate result of the aforementioned acts of Officer

Paruszkiewicz, the next of kin of Michael Westley suffered great losses of a personal and

pecuniary nature, including, but not limited to, the loss of society, companionship, and support of
the decedent, as well as grief, sorrow and mental suffering, subjecting the Defendant to liability
pursuant to the Wrongful Death Act.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff, Chantell Brooks, as Special Administrator of the Estate of Michael Westley, deceased, prays that judgment be entered against Defendants Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz and the City of Chicago in an amount necessary to fully and fairly compensate the next of kin of Michael Westley for their losses under the terms of the Wrongful Death Act, which substantially exceed the minimum jurisdiction amount of this Honorable Court, plus costs.

COUNT III ILLINOIS SURVIVAL STATUTE AGAINST POLICE OFFICER KEVIN PARUSZKIEWICZ AND CITY OF CHICAGO

- 18. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 10 by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 19. As a direct and proximate result of the aforementioned acts of Officer

 Paruszkiewicz, acting with the scope of employment of the City of Chicago, Plaintiff's decedent,

 Michael Westley, did suffer serious injuries of a personal and pecuniary nature, including but not

 limited to, pain and suffering experienced as he was dying from the gunshot wounds inflicted by

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff, Chantell Brooks, as Special Administrator of the Estate of Michael Westley, deceased, prays that judgment be entered against Defendants Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz and the City of Chicago in an amount necessary to fully and fairly compensate the Estate for all losses compensable under the terms of the Survival Statute, plus costs.

COUNT IV ILLINOIS FAMILY EXPENSE ACT AGAINST POLICE OFFICER KEVIN PARUSZKIEWICZ AND CITY OF CHICAGO

- 20. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 14 by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 21. As a direct and proximate result of the aforementioned acts of Officer

 Paruszkiewicz, Plaintiff's decedent, Michael Westley, and his Estate sustained losses in the form

 of funeral and burial expenses.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiff, Chantell Brooks, as Special Administrator of the Estate of Michael Westley, deceased, prays that judgment be entered against Defendants Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz and the City of Chicago in an amount necessary to fully and fairly compensate the Estate for all losses compensable under the terms of the Illinois Family Expense Statute.

COUNT V INDEMNIFICATION CLAIM PURSUANT TO 745 ILCS 10/9-102 AGAINST CITY OF CHICAGO

- 22. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 21 by reference as if fully set forth herein.
- 23. Illinois law provides that public entities are directed to pay any tort judgment for compensatory damages for which employees are liable within the scope of their employment activities.
- 24. Officer Paruszkiewicz is and/or was an employee of the City of Chicago and acted within the scope of his employment for the City of Chicago in committing the acts described herein.

WHEREFORE, should Defendant Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz be found liable for the acts alleged above, Defendant City of Chicago would be liable to pay the Plaintiff any judgment obtained against Defendant Police Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz.

COUNT VI <u>RESPONDEAT SUPERIOR</u> AGAINST CITY OF CHICAGO

- 25. Plaintiff incorporates paragraphs 1 through 21 by reference as if fully set forth herein.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The body was that of a well-developed, well-nourished, Black male received with a blue hospital gown draped over the body. Accompanying the body was a black T-shirt; multicolored bathing suit; tan cargo shorts; a tan belt; white socks; and gray sneakers. Identification bands on the bilateral great toes and the right wrist bore the name "MICHAEL WESLEY." Two hospital identification bands bore the name "WESTLEY, MICHAEL and "DOE, YATES." The body weighed 162 pounds, was 72 inches in height and appeared older than the reported age of 15 years.

The body was slightly warm centrally. Full rigor mortis was present to an equal degree in all extremities. There was minimal lividity on the posterior surfaces of the body except in areas exposed to pressure.

The scalp hair was black, kinky and 1/8 of an inch in length. Facial hair consisted of a few very fine hairs on the upper lip. The irides were brown, the corneae were clear, the sclerae were white, and the conjunctivae were pink/tan and free of petechiae. The pupils were equal at 5.0 millimeters in diameter. Blood flowed from the external nares and the oral cavity. The right earlobe was pierced.

There were no transverse creases of the lower pinnae. The lips were without evidence of injury. The teeth were in good condition.

Examination of the neck showed no evidence of injury. The abdomen was flat. No healed surgical scars were noted.

There was a 1.0-inch scar on the left side of the back, a 2-1/4 inch scar on the right side of the lower back, and nonspecific scars on the back of the left hand.

The extremities showed no gross bony deformities or pitting edema. The fingernails were intact and the finger pads had been printed. Tattoos were not noted. Needle tracks were not observed.

The external genitalia were those of an uncircumcised male in late adolescence. The anus was atraumatic.

EVIDENCE OF THERAPY

Evidence of medical intervention consisted of a sutured left thoracotomy incision extending to the mid axillary line; a right sided chest tube; an endotracheal tube secured by tape; a left tibial intraosseous line; and an intravenous catheter in the right inguinal region.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

PENETRATING GUNSHOT WOUND TO THE LEFT ARM AND CHEST: There was a 1/2 x 1/4 inch ovoid entrance gunshot wound to the upper lateral left triceps region centered 15.0 inches below the top of the head. This was surrounded by an eccentric abrasion collar measuring up to 1/8 of an inch at the 7 o'clock wound margin. There was no soot deposition and gunpowder tattooing on the surrounding skin.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

Continued

The projectile lacerated the skin and soft tissues prior to exiting through the skin of the posterior left axilla. The exit wound was a $1-1/8 \times 3/8$ inch irregular wound centered 12.0 inches below the top of the head and 10-3/4 of an inch to the left of the anterior midline.

The projectile immediately reentered the body in the posterior left axilla through an irregular $1-1/8 \times 1/2$ inch wound centered 13.0 inches below the top of the head and 10-1/2 inches to the left of the anterior midline.

The bullet went on to lacerate the skin and soft tissues; fracture the left sixth rib posterolaterally; perforate the superior aspect of the lower lobe of the left lung and the left mainstem bronchus; lacerate the base of the pulmonary artery and the right ventricle immediately below the pulmonic valve; and lacerate the medial aspect of the upper lobe of the right lung anteriorly.

This gunshot wound was associated with 200 mL of blood in the left pleural cavity and 150 mL of blood in the right pleural cavity.

There was no re-exit wound.

A mushroomed, medium caliber, copper jacketed bullet was recovered from the right chest cavity.

The wound path was directed left to right, slightly downward, and slightly back to front.

OTHER INJURIES: There were 1/4 and 5/8 inch abrasions on the right side of the forehead.

There were superficial, perhaps healing, abrasions on the right pretibial region.

A superficial $7/8 \times 1/8$ inch abrasion/laceration was on the midback just left of the posterior midline.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

Body Cavities:

The body was opened by the usual thoracoabdominal incision and the chest plate was removed. No adhesions were present in any of the body cavities. All body organs were present in the normal anatomical positions. The subcutaneous fat layer of the abdominal wall was 1.0 centimeters thick.

Head: (Central Nervous System)

The scalp was reflected. The calvarium of the skull was removed. The dura mater and falx cerebri were intact. There was no subdural or epidural hemorrhage. The leptomeninges were thin with focal clouding but no frank exudate. The cerebral hemispheres were symmetrical. The structures at the base of the brain, including the cranial nerves and blood vessels, were intact. Coronal sections through the cerebral hemispheres revealed no focal lesions. Transverse sections through the brainstem and cerebellum were unremarkable. The brain weighed 1692 grams. The spinal cord was not examined.

Neck:

Examination of the soft tissues of the neck, including the strap muscles and large vessels, revealed no abnormalities. The hyoid bone and larynx were intact.

Cardiovascular System:

The pericardial surfaces were smooth and glistening; the pericardial sac was free of significant fluid or adhesions. The coronary arteries arose normally, followed the usual distribution and were widely patent with no evidence of significant atherosclerosis or thrombosis. The cardiac chambers were of their usual size. Except for the pulmonic valve, the cardiac valves were without note. The myocardium was redbrown and firm; the atrial and ventricular septa were intact. The aorta and its major branches arose normally, followed the usual course and were widely patent.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

Continued

The vena cavae and their major tributaries returned to the heart in the usual distribution and were free of thrombi. The heart weighed 264 grams.

Respiratory System:

The upper airway contained a small amount of bloody fluid and gastric contents; the mucosal surfaces were yellow-tan and granular. The pleural surfaces were smooth and glistening. The lungs were atelectatic. The right lung showed prominent "leopard spotting"; the parenchyma of the left lung was pink except for hemorrhage along the wound path. No mass lesions were noted. There was minimal anthracosis. The pulmonary arteries were normally developed and without thrombus or embolus. The right lung weighed 270 grams; the left lung weighed 226 grams.

Liver and Biliary System:

The hepatic capsule was smooth, glistening and intact covering moderately firm, red/brown parenchyma. No mass lesions were noted. The gallbladder contained 12 milliliters of watery, green-brown bile; the mucosa was velvety and unremarkable. The extrahepatic biliary tree was patent, without evidence of calculi. The liver weighed 1189 grams.

Alimentary System:

The tongue exhibited no evidence of recent injury. The esophagus was lined by gray-white, smooth mucosa. The gastric mucosa was slightly autolyzed and the lumen contained approximately 150 milliliters of thick brown liquid with food particles including possible pasta and chicken. The small and large bowels were unremarkable. The pancreas had an autolyzed, red/tan, lobulated appearance and the ducts were clear. The appendix was present.

Genitourinary System:

The renal capsules were smooth and thin, semitransparent, and stripped with ease from the underlying smooth, red-brown cortical surfaces. The cortices were sharply delineated from the medullary pyramids which were purple-tan and unremarkable. The calyces, pelves and ureters were without note. The urinary bladder contained 60 milliliters of yellow urine; the mucosa was gray-tan and smooth. The prostate gland and seminal vesicles were without note. The right kidney weighed 137 grams; the left kidney weighed 136 grams.

Reticuloendothelial System:

The spleen had a smooth, intact capsule covering red-purple, moderately firm parenchyma; the lymphoid follicles were unremarkable. The regional lymph nodes appeared normal. The spleen weighed 102 grams.

Endocrine System:

The pituitary, thyroid and adrenal glands were unremarkable.

Musculoskeletal System:

Muscle development was normal. No non-traumatic bone or joint abnormalities were noted.

PATHOLOGIC DIAGNOSES

- I. Gunshot wound to the left arm with re-entry into the left axillary region; injury to bilateral lungs, heart, and pulmonary artery; projectile recovered from right chest cavity; no evidence of close-range firing on the skin.
- II. Abrasions of right side of forehead, right pretibial region, and lower back.

OPINION

This 15-year-old Black male, MICHAEL WESTLEY, died of a gunshot to the left arm. After passing through the arm, the bullet reentered the chest causing injuries to the lungs and heart.

MANNER OF DEATH: Homicide.

SUMMARY OF INCIDENT:

On 16 June 2013 at approximately 2254 hours, several Gang and Tactical units were responding to the area of 6500 South Peoria because of a report of shots fired. While searching the area, Beat 767D, Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz (driver) and Officer Michael Decker (passenger), observed the subject, Michael Westley, running east on 66th Street. Officer Paruszkiewicz began to chase Mr. Westley on foot along with Tactical Officers Gilmore and Schmidt. Officer Gilmore observed Mr. Westley turn toward Officer Paruszkiewicz and point a firearm toward Officer Paruszkiewicz. Officer Gilmore yelled, "Gun, shoot!" and Officer Paruszkiewicz fired two rounds, fatally striking Mr. Westley.

INVESTIGATION:

In a statement with IPRA, Officer Kevin Paruszkiewicz, #17844, stated he was working Beat 767D with Officer Decker, #18838 during the time of the incident. Officer Paruszkiewicz stated he was on-duty in citizen's dress wearing a protective vest, with his star displayed. The officers were responding to a call of multiple shots fired at 65th and Sangamon, Green, and Peoria. The officers drove a Chevy Impala, #3839, and were heading westbound on 66th Street. Officer Paruszkiewicz stated he saw a black male in a black T-shirt running. They followed him by car until the male, now known as Michael Westley stopped running. Officer Paruszkiewicz exited the vehicle to approach Mr. Westley by foot. As soon as Mr. Westley saw him approach, he began to run again. Officer Paruszkiewicz gave his location to dispatch and saw an unmarked Tahoe show up. Two officers exited the Tahoe and began running behind him. Officer Paruszkiewicz kept shouting, "Stop, police!" to Mr. Westley. The other officers stated they were officers as well. Officer Paruszkiewicz recognized their voices as those of Officers Gilmore and Schmidt. Officer Paruszkiewicz continued to tell Mr. Westley to stop, until Mr. Westley turned around and pointed a weapon at him. Officer Paruszkiewicz drew his weapon after he heard an officer say, "Gun, gun, shoot, shoot!" He fired twice at Mr. Westley, and saw him drop the weapon in the middle of the street. Mr. Westley then stumbled into the grass and fell. Officer Paruszkiewicz stated Mr. Westley was about 10 feet away when he discharged his firearm. He stated that there was no option to take cover, since the officers were in the middle of the street. After Mr. Westley was shot, Officer Paruszkiewicz requested an ambulance. (Att. 29, 30)

In a statement with IPRA, Officer Richard Schmidt, #7422, stated hewas working Beat 762E with Officer Gilmore, #16158, during the time of the incident. Officers Schmidt and Gilmore were responding to a shots fired call at approximately 66th and Halsted Street. Officer Schmidt stated he and Officer Gilmore observed Mr. Westley, who was wearing white shorts and a black T-shirt, running eastbound on 66th Street toward their unmarked Chevy Tahoe, #2634. After Mr. Westley turned on Sangamon, the officers began pursuing him. They were chasing Mr. Westley on foot, and noticed Officer Paruszkiewicz chasing him as well. Officers Schmidt and Gilmore were running behind Officer Paruszkiewicz. Officer Schmidt observed Mr. Westley turn around with a blue steel semi-automatic handgun in his hand. He heard Officer Gilmore say, "Gun, gun,

shoot, shoot!" Officer Paruszkiewicz drew his weapon and fired twice at Mr. Westley. Officer Schmidt stated that Mr. Westley was about 5-7 feet away from Officer Paruszkiewicz. After Mr. Westley was shot, Officer Schmidt conducted a protective pat down on him. A second firearm was found on Mr. Westley and he was handcuffed. (Att. 26, 27)

In a statement with IPRA, Officer Patrick Gilmore, #16158 stated he was working Beat 762E with Officer Schmidt at the time of the incident. Officer Gilmore related essentially the same information as Officer Schmidt. Officer Gilmore added he saw Mr. Westley turn around and observed him holding a blue firearm in his right hand. He yelled, "Gun, gun, shoot, shoot!" to Officer Paruszkiewicz. After Mr. Westley was shot, Officer Gilmore stated that his handcuffs were used to handcuff Mr. Westley but is unsure as to who handcuffed him. Officer Gilmore added that the second firearm was found in the front right pants pocket of Mr. Westley. (Att. 32, 33)

In a statement with IPRA, witness stated he was in front of his home when he observed nine young black males going north on Sangamon Street. Several minutes later, he saw three males running south on Sangamon Street with police officers in pursuit. The males split up and one male was left running in the street. Mr. stated he heard the officers yell toward the male to drop the gun. He heard two gunshots and saw a weapon on the ground. Mr. stated he could not see the male because his parked vehicle obstructed his view. The officer closest to the male fired twice, and Mr. stated the officer appeared to be either white or Hispanic. (Att. 35, 37, 54)

In a statement with IPRA, Sergeant Dale Martin, #2065, related that he was working Beat 720, and responded to a report of multiple loud reports (gunshots) in the area of 65th and Peoria Street. Sergeant Martin heard a call on his radio about one of the tactical units involved in a foot pursuit at approximately 6500 S. Sangamon. Sergeant Martin stated he was about four houses away when he saw the officers running toward Mr. Westley. He heard two shots fired and called for an ambulance. Mr. Westley was resisting arrest after he was shot and was still alive when he was taken into custody. When Mr. Westley was being arrested, a second weapon was recovered from him. A revolver was recovered from Mr. Westley's right pants pocket. Around this time, Mr. Westley ceased breathing. Sergeant Martin took over the duties of crime scene sergeant and directed officers to secure the scene and the dropped weapon. When the ambulance arrived, the paramedics placed heart monitors on Mr. Westley. Mr. Westley had a pulse at this time. Sergeant Martin stated he did not directly observe the shooting. He did observe a gunshot wound to Mr. Westley's left arm. (Att. 58, 59)

The Original Case Incident Report relates that Michael Westley committed aggravated assault towards Officers Gilmore, Paruszkiewicz, and Schmidt at 6610 S. Sangamon Street. The report indicates the officers had no relationship with Mr. Westley. Mr. Westley was transported to Christ Memorial hospital by CFD Ambulance 14 with a fatal injury. The report shows Mr. Westley as a black male, 15 years of age, with black

hair and a dark complexion. Mr. Westley is shown as the owner of a pistol and a revolver found in his possession. (Att. 5)

The Tactical Response Reports completed by Officers Gilmore, Paruszkiewicz, and Schmidt related that, Michael Westley did not follow verbal direction and fled from the officers. Mr. Westley was armed with a semi-automatic weapon and presented himself as likely to cause death or great bodily harm. Officer Paruszkiewicz related he fired twice at Mr. Westley. He used a department issued Glock 19 semi-automatic pistol with serial number. Mr. Westley was about 5-10 feet away from Officer Paruszkiewicz. The incident occurred outdoors in clear weather conditions under good artificial lighting. (Att. 6, 8, 10)

The Officer's Battery Reports completed by Officers Gilmore, Paruszkiewicz, and Schmidt related, the officers were responding to a call regarding a man with a gun. Mr. Westley was armed with a semi-automatic weapon and used the weapon to hold the officer at gunpoint. There were no injuries inflicted to the officers. (Att. 7, 9, 11)

The Case Supplementary Report listed Officers Gilmore, Paruszkiewicz, and Schmidt as victims of the incident. The report related that, Mr. Westley committed aggravated assault with a handgun toward the officers. Mr. Westley possessed a pistol and a revolver at the time of the incident. (Att. 12)

The Unit Inventory list from 17 June 2013 showed a 2013 Ford Intercept, #PD8862, a 2005 Chevy Impala, #PD3839, and a 2011 Chevy Tahoe, #PD2634 were in use on 16 June 2013. (Att. 13)

The **Event Query** showed there were calls relating about a group of males running. There were about 15-16 shots fired from an automatic weapon around 6600 S. Green Street. The reports show units 6769D, 762B, 762E, and 710R present at the location. The event query included remarks about an officer giving dispatch a description of a male the officer was chasing by foot. There were remarks about shots fired by police. Mr. Westley had a gunshot wound to the chest and was in critical condition. The event query related Ambulance 14 was on scene and transported Mr. Westley to Christ Hospital where he was pronounced dead. (Att. 15, 49)

The MIS GPS 001 Report showed Beat 767D in vehicle #3839. The report showed vehicle #3839 in motion until about 2253 hours. The report listed all the vehicles in the vicinity of 6610 S. Sangamon along with their coordinates. (Att. 16, 18)

The Chicago Fire Department (CFD) Incident Report #131672101 related that Mr. Westley was found unresponsive and not breathing upon their arrival. The ambulance was called to the location because of a gun shot wound initiated by the responding officers when Mr. Westley did not comply. Mr. Westley was found lying on the west parkway with a gun in his pocket and another gun in the middle of the street. The report related Mr. Westley had a gunshot wound to the left flank area of the ribs with no exit wound. He was found lying on his right side with his back bleeding. The reported related

that he was given advanced life support care, then bi-lateral needle decompression. The ambulance transported Mr. Westley to Christ Hospital. (Att. 22)

The CPD Crime Scene Processing Report lists all the inventoried items found at the crime scene, including a Glock 19C, expended shells, an extended magazine, swabs of biological material, a GSR kit, and Officer Paruszkiewicz's weapon and ammunition. The report stated the pistol recovered from Mr. Westley had serial # and was stolen from Hammond, Indiana. The revolver recovered from Mr. Westley had serial #BPU8634 and was not registered. The revolver was a Smith and Wesson 640 and contained five spent cartridges. (Att. 40)

The ISP Division of Forensic Services Laboratory Report showed Officer Paruszkiewicz's weapon was found to be in firing condition. The report related that a bullet and two casings found at the scene were fired from Officer Paruszkiewicz's weapon. The pistol Mr. Westley possessed was found in operable condition. (Att. 67, 82)

A Canvass found several witnesses who observed part of the incident. William Carter did not witness the incident but was awakened by the gunshots. Mr. Carter, who resided at 6615 South Sangamon Street, went to the window and observed a black male lying on the ground and a handgun on the ground next to the male. He also observed the male being removed by an ambulance minutes later. (Att. 23, 53)

A **Sketch** showed Mr. Westley running northbound on Sangamon Street at the time of the incident. Officer Paruszkiewicz was in front of 6615 S. Sangamon Street when he fired twice at Mr. Westley. Mr. Westley fell in front of 6610 S. Sangamon on the grass next to the curb. The sketch showed the location of a POD camera at Sangamon and 66th Street. Locations of the evidence markers are drawn and noted. The sketch was drawn by Evidence Technician Paul Presnell, #17122. (Att #40)

Photographs showed Mr. Westley's firearms. A pistol was shown with an extended magazine and a revolver. Photographs of Mr. Westley showed stitches at the left side of his chest and the bullet entry wound on his upper left arm. Photographs of the scene showed the layout of the location, Mr. Westley's weapon, blood in the grass in front of 6610 S. Sangamon, and the location of the evidence markers. (Att. 42)

POD 1082 showed images of a black male running north on the 6600 block of Sangamon Street. A tactical officer was seen following the male. The images then show the crime scene being secured with tape. (Att. 45)

The **OEMC** calls included radio transmissions about units responding to multiple shots fired. The call stated there were several males running westbound and the officer stated the firearm was definitely an automatic weapon. The officer gave a description of Mr. Westley and his location. The officer stated Mr. Westley was shot at 6610 S. Sangamon and he requested an ambulance. The officer stated the shots were fired by the police and Mr. Westley was shot in the chest. (Att. 47, 48)

The In-car camera from car #8862, showed that it was assigned to Sergeant Dale, #2065. The images showed the location of the shooting, the officers handcuffing Mr. Westley, the recovered gun in the street, the ambulance arriving and leaving with Mr. Westley, and the crime scene being secured. (Att.56, 57)

The Report of the Postmortem Examination of Michael Westley, revealed a gunshot wound to his upper right arm and his chest. The medical examiner, Dr. Cina, identified a gunshot entry wound to Mr. Westley's upper right arm. The round then exited the right arm and entered the left side of his chest. The bullet went through Mr. Westley's left lung, through his pulmonary artery, right ventricle, then into his right lung. Dr. Cina did not observe any powder or tattooing around the entrance wound, which indicated Mr. Westley was not shot at close range. The Autopsy report included photos of Mr. Westley's clothing, including his shirt with a bullet hole, and the spent round found in Mr. Westley's chest. The autopsy report included close up photos of Mr. Westley's face, torso, and legs both front and back. These photos showed the entry wound on his upper left arm, the exit wound of the left arm, and the entry wound into his chest. Dr. Cina found the cause of death to be a gunshot wound to the left arm and chest, and the manner of death to be a homicide. (Att. 20, 43,83)

The **Medical Records** from Christ Hospital indicated that Michael Westley had a gunshot wound to the left axillas. During CPR, Mr. Westley never showed vital signs and never regained consciousness. He showed no verbal response, no motor response, and no eye opening movement. There was no pulse or circulation. The doctor pronounced Mr. Westley dead. The doctor's diagnosis was an open arm wound, open wound axillae, hemothorax, traumatic arrest, pneumothorax, and acute blood loss anemia. (Att. 64)

Civil Suit 13 CV5871 was filed on behalf of the estate of Michael Westley for wrongful death. (Att.81)

CONCLUSION AND FINDING:

This investigation found that Officer Paruszkiewicz's use of deadly force was in compliance with Chicago Police Department policy. According to the Chicago Police Department's General Order 03-02-03, III (A):

- A. "a sworn member is justified in using force likely to cause death or great bodily harm *only* when he or she reasonably believes that such force is necessary:
 - 1. to prevent death or great bodily harm to the sworn member or to another person, or:
 - 2. to prevent an arrest from being defeated by resistance or escape and the sworn member reasonably believes that the person to be arrested:
 - a. has committed or has attempted to commit a forcible felony which involves the infliction, threatened infliction, or threatened use of physical force likely to cause death or great bodily harm or;
 - b. is attempting to escape by use of a deadly weapon or;
 - c. otherwise indicates that he or she will endanger human like or inflict great bodily harm unless arrested without delay."

Officer Paruszkiewicz was taking part of locating a subject with a gun who was suspected of firing multiple shots. After locating the subject, now known as Michael Westley, the officers chased him and attempted to take him into custody. Michael Westley attempted to evade arrest by attempting to harm the officers. Officer Paruszkiewicz, who was in fear of his life and the life of his fellow officers, fired at Mr. Westley. All witnesses and officers present at the incident confirm the incident as stated above. Therefore, based on the totality of circumstances surrounding the incident, Officer Paruszkiewicz'actions were in compliance with the Use of Force model and general orders.
